The **Calusa Nature Center & Planetarium** (www.calusanature.org) is a 105-acre site with nature trails, a museum, a Planetarium, butterfly and bird aviaries, and picnic areas.

Lee County Manatee Park (www.leegov.com/parks/parks/manateepark) is where you can observe endangered Manatee in their natural habitat.

IMAG History & Science Center (www.theimag.org) is a fun-filled interactive learning center for all ages. Touch live sea life, engineer a creation, run through a rainstorm!

The local beaches offer the best shelling. Learn more about what types of shells you've spotted on the sand by stopping at the **Bailey-Matthews National Shell Museum** (www.shellmuseum.org).

Step back in time at the **Edison & Ford Winter Estates** (www.edisonfordwinterestates.org). Thomas Edison's 14-acre riverfront estate is home to the inventor's laboratory and experimental gardens as well as a collection of rare antique automobiles and Edison phonographs. Step next door to the 3-acre winter estate of automobile industrialist Henry Ford. See a 1914 Model T, a 1917 Ford truck and a 1929 Model A.

Burroughs Home (www.burroughshome.com), one of Fort Myers' oldest homes, is where you'll travel back in time through colorful tales of living in this Georgian-revival mansion that was the scene of many social events hosting Fort Myers' elite including the Edisons, Fords and Firestones.

Old Town Sanibel encircles the east end of the island near the Sanibel Lighthouse. Historically, it was the center of the island's activity; today, it is a place to stroll quaint shops, inns and restaurants.

More fascinating history can be found at **Sanibel Historical Museum and Village** (www.sanibelmuseum.org), which includes "Uncle" Clarence Rutland's home, Bailey's General Store, the 1926 post office, Miss Charlotta's Tea Room, Burnap Cottage, a pioneer garden, Model-T truck, 1890's surrey (fringe included) and replica packing house.
